

### Anti-Doping Commission:

Three members

Elected by the P/A upon proposal by the M/C

- 1 Chair (possibly a legal counsel)
- 1 Board Member (possibly a Vice President appointed by the President)
- 1 Doctor, member of the TUE committee

In charge of:

- the general anti-doping policy of the ISMF
- coordinating testing
- supervising testing
- monitoring target athletes
- monitoring retired athletes
- etc.

### Anti-doping testing:

Delegated to organisers following agreement between the organiser, the national anti-doping agency, the national federation and ISMF.

During testing and under certain circumstances, the athlete may apply for a retroactive TUE.

### WADA-AMA approved laboratory

- Communicates results to the Chair of the Independent Anti-Doping Review Panel 7.1.1.
- **President of ISMF 7.1.1.**

### Independent Anti-Doping Review Panel:

Appointed by the Board

3 members with experience in anti-doping issues

- 1 chair, jurist (possibly a legal counsel)
- 1 doctor (preferentially, or a biologist, or a pharmacist)
- 1 jurist

*Principle of confidentiality*

- Receives the results
- Reviews TUE or lack of TUE
- Informs the athlete of his/her position, rights and proceedings
- Reviews incriminating and exculpatory evidence

### National Federation

Anti-doping commission of the national federation of the athlete instigates a case according to ISMF regulations and at its own expense:

- National anti-doping commission and appeal
- National disciplinary commission and appeal

### TUE Committee

Appointed by the Board (4.4.5.)

Three doctors, including a chair  
Analyses TUE applications and delivers  
TUEs (4.4.4) + (4.4.6)
